YARD DEBRIS PROCEDURES

Place all garden and yard trash - including tree and shrub trimmings, grass clippings, palm fronds, and small tree branches - either in a 32 gallon trash can or commingled with garbage in a 96 gallon container, or in a suitable plastic bag. Shrubs, branches, limbs and palm fronds should not exceed four feet in length, and must be bundled and tied. No single item, can, bag or tied bundle should exceed 50 pounds in weight, other than the 96 gallon container. No more than four cans, bags or bundles may be set out for collection at one time.

Excessive amounts or bulk yard trash items: If more than four cans, bags or tied bundles of yard trash need to be set out, or piles of heavy logs and/or stacks of wood fencing, please contact Waste Pro at 352-366-0352 to schedule a quote. Once payment is received, Waste Pro will schedule a rear loader collection vehicle or claw truck to collect excessive/bulk yard trash material.

HYDRANT FLUSHING WILL BE CONTINUED

Hydrants in Town will continue to be flushed for annual maintenance. Should you have questions, please contact Town Hall .
